Information about PE and Sport Premium Funding

Schools receive PE and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6. In most cases the amount received is determined by how many pupils at the school attract the funding using data from the January School Census.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of PE and sports activities they offer their pupils but there are few to choose how they want to spend the money for example:

- Hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers to improve provision
- Support and involve children through extra curricular activities
- Provide training resources in PE and sport for teachers
- Run sport competitions to increase pupils' participation and opportunities

Schools are required to publish on their website details of how they spend (or will spend) their PE and Sports Premium. They must also include details about the impact this funding has on pupils PE and sport participation and attainment.
